Fluency Transfer System & Curriculum Development

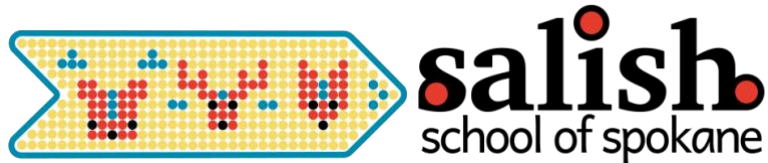
