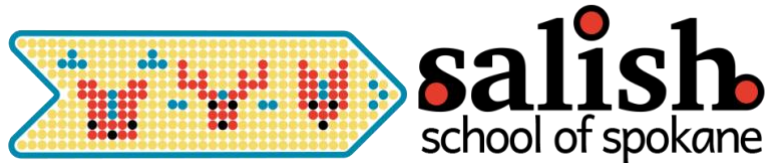

## 2020 Summer Immersion Symposium Draft Workshops

- A. Salish Immersion for Ages 1-3:** How to establish and operate a full Salish immersion Language Nest for very young children that accelerates their development and surrounds them with a loving, cultural environment.
- B. Salish Immersion ECEAP/Preschool:** How to meet national standards in ECE, get funding from the State of Washington, use the Creative Curriculum & Teaching Strategies Gold, and have outstanding cultural outcomes in a Salish Immersion preschool.
- C. Salish Immersion Kindergarten:** How to do total Salish immersion while also launching Salish and home-language literacy, getting good math done, and rocking their 5 year old worlds with hands-on science.
- D. Salish Immersion Early Elementary School:** How to achieve outstanding objectives in Salish literacy, home-language literacy, and math while establishing old-school self-discipline and cultural roots.
- E. Salish Immersion Middle Grades:** How to ensure your students love to read, excel at math (algebra in Salish!!!), know their culture, and have the social-emotional and leadership skills they will need for a happy, successful life.
- F. Transitional Bilingual High School:** How to build a successful secondary program by teaching advanced math, science, English, and social studies while still boosting, celebrating and accelerating student Salish fluency and cultural competence.
- G. Training an Army of Fluent Teachers and Parents:** How to provide systematic, successful language training for teachers and parents so you can initiate and sustain immersion education programs that will lead to intergenerational use and transmission of the language.
